Literacy

Non-Fiction:

How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth.

The children will use the story to write a set of instructions on how to wash a chosen animal. Focusing on imperative verbs, prepositions and bullet points.

Fiction:

Stone Age Boy

The children will write a descriptive paragraph based on the images in a novel about a boy discovering the Stone Age.

Numeracy

<u>Addition and Subtraction:</u> Bridging 10.

The children will:

- Add 3 addends efficiently
- Use a 'first, now and then' structure
- Explain that addends can be added in any order
- Add two numbers that bridge through 10
- Subtract two numbers that bridge through 10.

Numbers to 1,000

The children will understand:

- There are ten tens in 100.
- 100 can be divided into 50s,
 20s and 25s, units usually used in measure.
- Know addition facts can be used to calculate complements to 100.
- Know strategies for addition and subtraction across the tens boundary and apply this to calculate across the hundreds boundary in multiples of 10.
- Be able to cross 100 from any two digit or one digit number.

Art - Gestural Drawing

Children will:

- Use sketchbooks to record and evaluate their ideas.
- Make loose and gestural drawings with charcoal, experimenting with their own cave art.
- Explore drama and performance through art.
