They enjoyed walking around the lake, spotting some of the British wildlife they have read about in their shared reading book, 'Little Foxes' by Michael Morpurgo. They stopped at three locations to record all the different types of litter they could see. They found that the most common litter was plastic bottles, cups, food wrappers and cans, which they thought was due to people taking food away from the cafés and not using the bins there.
