#### YEAR 6 PSHE WORKSHOP



In the first part of the Autumn Term, all children across school were involved in a PSHE learning unit called 'Me and my relationships.' In Year 6, our children had the opportunity to watch a performance called 'Blind Side,' performed by 'Breaking Barriers.' This was a powerful monologue on the topic of violence against women and girls. The children then had some thoughtful discussions around this topic.

The children in Year 1 have been learning about Christianity in their Religious Education lessons, this term. They had lots of questions that they wanted to ask about this religion, so Reverend Anne Gilbert, who is our Chair of Governors, came to talk to the children about her role as a local vicar. She was delighted to answer their questions, and was impressed by their interest and knowledge.



## **PSHE Workshops**





We have changed our PSHE/RHE scheme in school, and are using a new scheme called Coram **SCARF**. S is for safety, C is for caring, A is for achievement, R is for resilience and F is for friendship. The children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 took part in workshops led by Rachel, from Coram SCARF. These workshops looked a range of topics, including their amazing bodies (Y2), the job of the brain (Y3), physical and mental health (Y4) and the dangers of drugs and smoking (Y5).The children met Gerald, the giraffe, too!

## **Rochdale Family Learning**

Some of the children in FS2 have been working with their parents this half term, as part of the Rochdale Family Learning project. They have been taking part in some exciting story sessions, learning about how Phonics is taught at school, and also visited Falinge Park together. At the park, we looked for signs of autumn and winter, found the bandstand and looked for different shapes in the garden areas. We even paid a visit to the duck pond and counted the ducks. Everyone had a super time.
