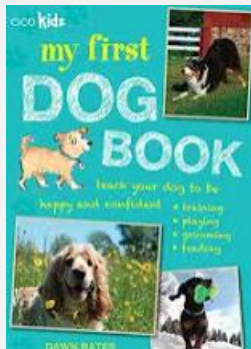
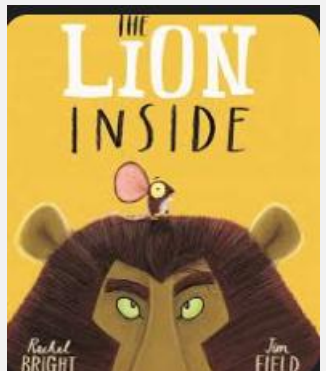
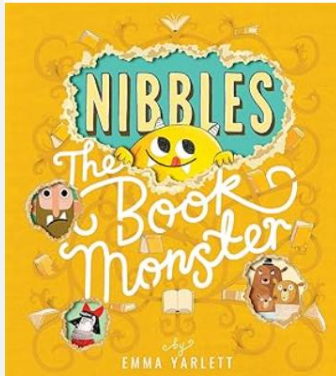
We use a variety of different books throughout the year for our English topics.

We have daily phonics sessions followed later in the day by shared reading sessions.

Reading Rewards

- Dragon Up sheet will be stuck in reading records.
- When you hear your child read, record it in their reading records and number each one.
- We will count one read per day towards their total.
- We will check reading records on a Tuesday and your child will receive their sticker when they have reached the number of reads.

Maths

We are using the Oak Academy maths scheme as it gives our children a clear, consistent and well-sequenced maths curriculum. It helps pupils build confidence, fluency and understanding step by step, while ensuring strong progression from one year group to the next.

The scheme supports high-quality teaching and allows us to adapt learning to meet the needs of all children.

This curriculum develops pupils' understanding of mathematics over time creating competent and confident mathematicians. The scheme will develop their ability to select the most suitable tools to solve problems across a range of topics and real-world scenarios.

Maths

Scaffolding and directed support are used to ensure children are mastering the small steps of progression.

We ensure challenge for all children by giving everyone the opportunity to develop fluency and reasoning skills at an appropriate level across a range of contexts, including through targeted questioning.

Rich mathematical talk - giving children the opportunity to explore mathematical concepts, resolve mistakes and identify misconceptions with growing independence.
Mistakes in maths are valued and celebrated. Unpicking these misconceptions so that children evaluate their thinking, and make changes and adaptations to future work, is vital in scaffolding them towards greater independent learning.

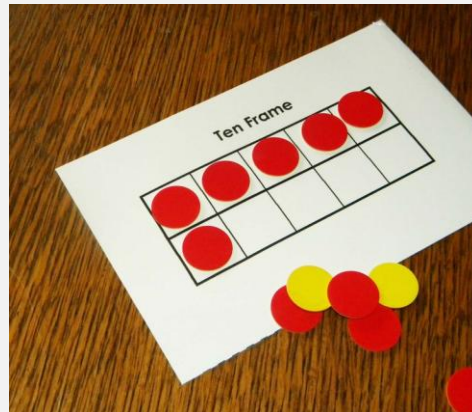

Mastering Number

In Reception through to year 3, we are using Mastering Number to strengthen children's understanding of number and improve their fluency.

This is delivered through short, regular sessions, taught 4 times a week for 5-10 minutes and is in addition to maths lessons.

Children practice key number facts and build confidence, accuracy and a deeper understanding of how numbers work. This gives them a strong foundation for success in maths.
