### Netball

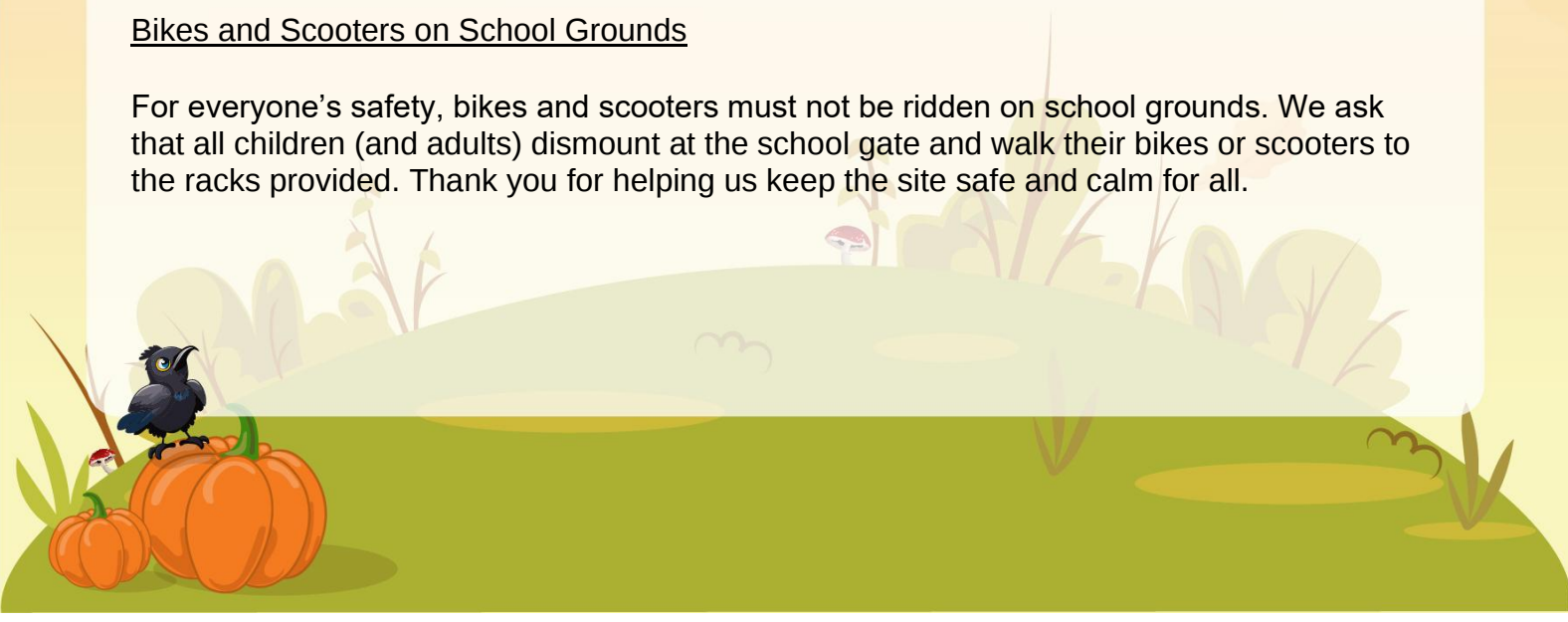

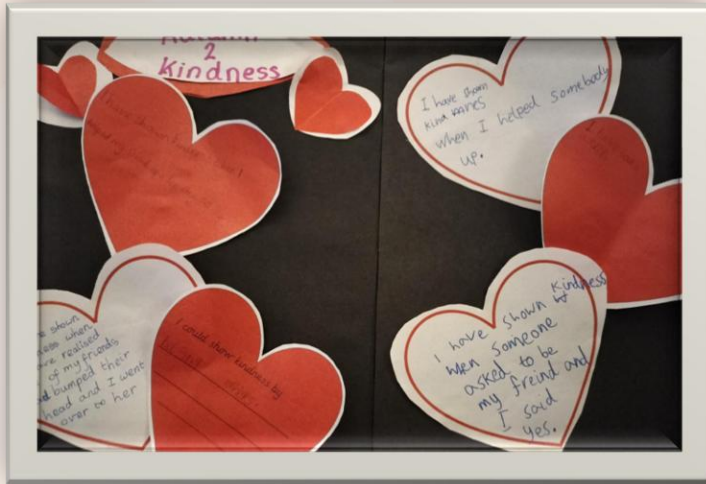
### Bikes and Scooters on School Grounds
