## Christian Values - Kindness

As we approach Christmas, we have been looking at ways we can show our value of kindness both in school and at home.

### **10 ACTS OF KINDNESS AT CHRISTMAS**

- 1** Make a Christmas card for someone who might feel lonely (a neighbour, care-home resident, or school staff member).
- 2** Donate a toy or book you no longer use to a charity or school fundraiser.
- 3** Help at home by doing a job without being asked – like tidying toys or setting the table.
- 4** Write a thank-you note to a teacher, teaching assistant, or lunchtime supervisor.
- 5** Make a small festive craft (like a paper decoration) to give to a friend or sibling.
- 6** Include someone new in a game at breaktime.
- 7** Collect food items (with help from adults) to contribute to a local food bank.
- 8** Compliment three people in one day with kind and positive words.
- 9** Help a younger child with reading, putting on their coat, or finding their way around school.
- 10** Create a 'Christmas kindness chain' by writing kind messages on paper strips and linking them together for a classroom display.
