Create a Stone Age themed board game with word problems based on operations of add, subtract, multiply and divide.	Research Mary Anning and create an information booklet about her.	Design, make and evaluate your own prehistoric creature. Use any materials you have at home. Give it a name and write a paragraph to describe it.
Design and make your own top trumps rock and gem cards. Use real facts and pictures. Allocate numbers according to how high value £ and how rare they are. Include their weight in g/kg	Create a fact file about Stone Henge or a similar ancient structure in Great Britain. You can add pictures and drawings to illustrate your work.	Reseach Stone Age cave paintings. Make a story retelling an event using only these pictures, for example collecting berries and preparing a meal or hunting and skinning an animal.

Write 5 questions to ask a Stone Age child. Role play the interview with someone at home.
Draw a picture of Stonehenge using different 2D shapes (what shape is the sun?©). Measure in cm how long and wide each stone is. Record the measurements on your picture.	Research and write a list of the food Stone Age people ate.	Choose an artefact to create (for example, jewellery or a weapon). You can use any media to make it, for example, modelling clay, lego, junk models, paintings or drawings.
