Maths	English	Foundation
Create nets for 3D shapes such as a cuboid and triangular based pyramid. Can you cut them out and build them?	Plan the journey that Robert Allen Scott would have taken to the Antarctic. Think about how he would have got there and what he would have needed, to achieve his mission.	Use a computer or draw a poster on what makes a trusted website, you can use a programme such as Word in order to show your understanding of the topic.
Research and draw a range of 2D shapes – up to and including shapes with 8 sides. Can you classify them using a venn diagram? Can you draw some that are regular or irregular polygons?	Create a biography on Robert Allen-Scott and his life and adventures. Think of the features that you need to include.	Create your own Viking Pattern border using the techniques that we have learnt in school. Can you research where there are examples of Viking patterns in the UK?
Continue to master telling the time on both an analogue and a digital clock including the 24 hour clock. (We may ask you to tell us what time it is at different intervals of the day!)	Research an animal which has blubber like the emperor penguin, can you create a fact file on this animal?	Create a life cycle of an animal of your choosing, this should contain 4 different stages of their lives.

You could also practise your squared numbers too!	Draw a detailed picture of an Emperor Penguin including captions to label different parts of the animal.	Plan a Plant Walk round your local area! Can you draw a map of your route? Can you sketch some of the plants you see on your travels? Perhaps you could look some of them up and find out their names! Make sure you ask an adult's permission first.
