You might want to choose symbols to represent certain amounts.	Investigate Stone circles. What are they? Where are they? Why were they built? Present your research in any way you wish (PowerPoint presentation, model, fact file, information booklet).	Research an aspect of prehistoric Britain, the Stone Age, Bronze Age or Iron Age and use what you find out to create a project. You can present your research in any way you wish. Why not try making a film or a podcast to show in class!
Create your own Stone Age themed word problems. Here's an example: Om needs 24 shells to make a Stone Age necklace. She has already collected 10. How many more shells does she need to collect?	Stone Age people could not pop to the shops for food. Everything they ate had to be caught or collected. Write your own recipe for a Stone Age dinner using the ingredients that would be available to them.	Stone Age people used to write stories on the walls of their caves through drawings. Make up your own story. It can be about anything you like but tell it through cave art pictures.
