### **Welcome back and Happy New Year!**

We hope that you had an enjoyable and restful break and are excited to continue with our learning this year.

This term we will begin our enquiry based topic- 'Survival of The Fittest' - a unique, child-led investigation combining science, geography and PSHE. The children will be exploring adaptation, inheritance and evolution, as well as researching a range of inspirational explorers— such as Darwin and Attenborough. The children will also be gaining an insight into the effects of climate change, deforestation and plastic pollution-where they will deepen their understanding of their own social responsibilities and citizenship.

### **English**

To fuel our children's imagination and creative writing, we will be studying texts in a range of genres and by a variety of significant authors. The children will explore real examples of effective narrative techniques and rich vocabulary, whilst being given the opportunity to write for a particular purpose. They will also be immersed into fictional worlds through drama - igniting curiosity, provoking enquiry and demanding critical thinking. Our first text is Hansel and Gretel by Neil Gaiman.

### **Maths**

In Maths, we will be continuing to ready ourselves for the SATs, however this half term there will be more of a focus on the reasoning papers. We will be looking at how to tackle longer questions and we will share our methods on class dojo.

### **Booster Sessions**

We will be running weekly maths and English boosters for ALL children to attend if they wish. These are non-compulsory. A timetable of these sessions will be shared on Dojo.

### **PE**

Children should continue to come to school in their PE kits on the days they have PE.

## **Home Learning**


### **Reading**
